Recently I was watching a TV news report on the ongoing environmental catastrophe in the Gulf of Mexico and contemplating what to write about in this issue when it suddenly became apparent. Like millions of other people, I am shocked and appalled at the environmental destruction and disruption of lives in the Gulf region. The effects of the disaster are not only going to be seen along the Gulf and possibly the Atlantic coast, but also among our bird populations here in Michigan within the next year and for decades to come. Thus, it is with a sense of trepidation that I think about this fall's migration. Knowing now what awaits birds that pass through or winter in the Gulf's coastal marshes is truly heartbreaking. I am equally saddened at the thought of how the disaster has ended a way of life of residents who depend on the natural resources of the gulf itself.


Knowing what birds are facing upon arriving on the Gulf coast, I have been wondering what we can we do to help. Of course, supporting "green" technologies, ones that put less stress on our natural world, is the long-term answer. In the short term, however, your participation in the role of citizenscientist will have an enormous, positive impact. Citizen-scientist activities have often been referred to as "birding with a purpose." Data from various surveys such as the Christmas Bird Count, breeding bird surveys, the North American Migration Count, and the Michigan Bird Survey will help determine the impact of the Gulf disaster on our local bird populations. Will the number of Green Herons and Virginia Rails observed in Michigan this year be reduced in subsequent years as a result of the oil in coastal marshes? We birders will be instrumental in helping to gauge the impact in our role of "citizen-scientists."

Changing topics, I am happy to report that Michigan Birds and Natural History is nearly back on schedule! The journal's editorial committee has worked hard over the last few months and I want to thank them for their time and dedication.

2009 Michigan Late Autumn Crane Survey

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Since 1979, a survey of Sandhill Cranes (*Grus canadensis*) has been conducted in Michigan (Hoffman 2009). Whooping Cranes (*G. americana*), are now included in the survey after being reported in the fall 2007 survey. See Hoffman (2009) for methods.

The 2009 survey was conducted between 29 October and 2 November except for 25, 14 and 6 November records from Kent, Lake and Ogemaw Counties respectively. These late reports were accepted because few cranes were believed counted north of those counties. More than 88 people participated this year submitting 82 reports compared to 51 reports from 65 volunteers in 2008. Forty-six of the reports were based on counts at night roosts and the rest were taken at fields.

The 2009 Michigan Sandhill Crane population index of 24,453 (Table 1) continued a trend of increased abundance at fall staging areas compared to previous years (Figure 1). It was 38% higher than the 2004-08 average index of abundance of 15,226 cranes and 27% higher than the 17,747 cranes reported in 2008 (Hoffman 2009). About half of the increase over 2008 was due to more cranes being counted in areas surveyed both years, and the rest of the increase was from areas not monitored the previous year. The largest concentration of 9382 cranes at Bernard Baker Sanctuary, Calhoun County, exceeded the previous high of 8528 counted in 2007.

In 2009, reported Sandhill Crane distribution expanded during late autumn compared to previous years. They were reported in 22 counties (Table 1) compared to the 2004-08 average of 16 counties (Hoffman 2009). Those seen in Clinton County were believed to have been counted at a night roost in Shiawassee County, so only one record was accepted. No cranes were found in 9 counties in 2009. Less than 1% of the cranes in 2009 were in 2 UP counties, 9 % in 3 NLP counties and 91% in SLP counties. Hoffman (2009) reported that during 1979-2008, 99% of the cranes at late autumn staging areas were seen in SLP. Increased coverage in NLP

partially explains the higher numbers there in 2009. Five south-central and southwestern SLP counties (Barry, Calhoun, Cass, Jackson and Kalamazoo) accounted for 81% of the state total.

Whooping Cranes were reported in both Cass and Jackson Counties.

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

Michigan Butterfly Survey, 2009

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Among reporters there was uniform opinion, especially in the southern part of the state, that this was an indifferent year for resident butterflies and a decidedly poor year for immigrant species. In the northern part of the state, butterflies in the tortoiseshell and anglewing groups made good showings.

The volatile month of March allowed for hibernatina butterflies to emerae on a few dates. A low temperature of 4° in Lansing on 3 March was followed by a high of 65° just three days later, and the first butterflies, Eastern Commas, were observed on the 6th. March temperatures were above normal, but warm enough for butterflies on only one more date, the 17th, when temperatures reached the upper 60s in the south and Mourning Cloaks were reported from several counties. The first half of April was very cool with significant snowfall statewide on the 5th and 6th and temperatures below normal throughout the period, except on the cloudy, damp 2^{nd} . The second half was warm but windy and very wet. Spring Azures were detected on the 17^{th} , the first day that temperatures reached 70° in central southern Michigan. One week later, on the 24th, temperatures reached 82° in Lansing, but this was followed by six days of rain with 3+ inches recorded in most of the Lower Peninsula. Though temperatures were warm enough to allow the emergence of several more species, clouds and rain deterred activity by any of these. By the end of April, a very small total of five species had been reported.

The month of May was without a strong weather pattern in the south. Temperatures alternated between somewhat below and somewhat above normal with warmer temperatures often accompanied by clouds and precipitation. Emergence of butterflies continued at a slow pace, with just six additional species reported by the 10th. After morning temperatures near freezing in southern Michigan on 18 May, temperatures reached 80° for the first time since April on the 20th and 21st and many species made a belated appearance. In the Upper Peninsula, where spring is later to arrive in any case, temperatures were well below normal in the last 10

days of May. Butterflies of any species were difficult to locate at the end of the month in Chippewa County. Perhaps because of the cool spring up north, the only reports of elfins this year were from the southern Lower Peninsula.

Concerning weather as related to butterflies, summer was an odd season at best. Temperatures were slightly below normal and precipitation was above normal. However, in spite of ample seasonal rainfall, a dry period struck at, apparently, just the wrong time for many species. After 2 inches of rain on 17 June, there was less than an inch of rain between that date and 22 July in southern Michigan. This affected other insects besides butterflies; my notes for 10 July in Hillsdale County comment "few deer flies; no puddles." Numbers and variety of midsummer butterflies suffered with the extensive dry period. In the Upper Peninsula, there was less rain through the summer, but it was distributed more evenly. There, in July and August, species such as Green and Gray Comma and Compton and Milbert's Tortoiseshell were numerous, and the rare Satyr Anglewing was detected.

In southern Michigan, the anglewings and tortoiseshells, like most groups were not particularly numerous. Most conspicuously lacking were several southern immigrants that are often common. The Red Admiral and the two ladies are all variable in numbers, but during most years, Red Admiral and American Lady are expected to be seen on a good day in the field in mid summer. This was not the case this year. The scarcity of the Red Admiral was particularly startling in view of its enormous numbers 2 years ago.

The scarcer immigrant butterflies that enter the state in the late summer and fall were also found in small numbers. If a species failed to appear during the warm and dry month of September, it was not very likely to be found during chilly October. In the latter month, temperatures in Lansing topped 63 only three days, with some precipitation on all of those dates. Thus opportunities to search for immigrants such as Common Buckeye were much diminished. Variegated Fritillary and Fiery Skipper were both unreported, in each case for the first time in my six years of doing the survey. In November, there were a few hospitable periods for butterflies in the first half of the month, but many of the individuals seen were unidentifiable female Colias, sp. Orange Sulphur and Mourning Cloak were the only species identified during the month.

A very respected figure in the study of Michigan butterflies, Mr. Owen A. Perkins, passed away on November 30, 2009. Mr. Perkins, a retired science teacher from Royal Oak, was among the most knowledgeable students of Lepidoptera in the state. He and others, notably Dwayne Badgero, spent much of the summer of 2009 searching for many of Michigan's most localized species. Findings were recorded at his LepAlert website, www. lepalert.org, a superb repository for sightings and photographs of Michigan Lepidoptera. Four species that he found this summer are listed below.

Northern Blue Lycaeides idas numerous east of Shingleton in Alger in late June and early July

Greenish Blue Plebejus saepiolus Alger in late June

Satyr Comma *Polygonia satyrus* found in several counties in the Upper Peninsula in August

Ottoe Skipper Hesperia ottoe Allegan in early July

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Michigan Bird Survey: Autumn 2009 (August-November)

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An excellent total of 314 species was reported from 336 observers. Eighty of 83 counties were covered (no reports from Alpena, Mecosta, and Newaygo counties). Data was submitted on paper forms, as has been the tradition since the 1940s, and observations were also gleaned from all state listservs, as well as from eBird (approximately 40% of all observations). The advent of blogs, Facebook, MySpace, and numerous photo-sharing sites where many birders are exclusively posting their bird sightings and photos, has made the task of compiling all these bird records much more complex. Birders should always submit their bird records either directly to the Michigan Bird Survey or to eBird, and provide photos and written documentation to the Michigan Bird Records Committee, to ensure that their records will be included in the ornithological record.

For the third fall season, Chip Francke organized and compiled a Lake Michigan Shoreline Count, conducted at 10 sites from Leelanau in the north to New Buffalo in the south. Observers counted for two hours, from 7:15 to 9:15 a.m. on each of three dates, 7 September, 10 October, and 7 November. Not all locales were covered every day. Highlights from these counts are incorporated into the species accounts below.

The Southeast Michigan Raptor Research organization was disolved prior to this fall's hawkwatch, which has been conducted at Lake Erie Metropark and the Pte. Mouillee State Game Area headquarters (both in Wayne County) since 1982. This year the newly renamed Detroit River Hawk Watch was funded and organized by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service and the International Wildlife Refuge Alliance. A total of 83 days were covered out of a total of 91 between 1 September and 30 November, with 8 days weathered out. A total of 98,577 raptors of 17 species was recorded.

Whitefish Point did not provide any official count compilation this fall. Information provided here has been taken from blog postings and eBird, and thus should not be considered final. Exactly 101,611 individuals of 73 species of waterbirds were counted this fall, which is about 20,000 above average and is the second highest fall total ever.

WEATHER

The below-normal temperatures and above-normal precipitation of the summer was broken on 9 August with the first 90+ degree day of the year in the southern Lower Peninsula. This was not to be a heat wave, however, as temperatures quickly returned to below normal for the remainder of the month and with continuing above-normal precipitation (3.7 inches of rain was recorded in Hillsdale Co. on 8-10 August). Conditions in the northern Lower Peninsula and Upper Peninsula during the month were described as cool and wet, though pleasant, by several observers.

September was also cooler but drier than normal, and there was not a single cold front until a strong front moved through on the 28th and 29th. This front brought a trace of snow to the Gwinn airport in the Upper Peninsula (SH). The pleasant conditions throughout the month made for a rather lackluster migration of those species influenced by strong cold fronts.

Early October continued cooler than average, with above-normal precipitation and a more typical pattern of cold fronts. A front passing through the state on 10-11 October brought the first trace of snow to the northwestern Lower Peninsula, and flurries in the southwestern Lower Peninsula on 15 October (JTW). In the Upper Peninsula it was cool to cold with early snowstorms but no accumulations.

Late October and all of November had above-normal temperatures statewide, and near normal precipitation throughout the state, but with no strong cold fronts. Hillsdale County was 5 degrees above normal and dry in November (JR). Parts of the northwestern Lower Peninsula may have had one of the warmest Novembers ever (BA). For the Upper Peninsula, descriptions of warmer than normal meant daytime high temperatures in the 40s and 50s, but the first snow accumulation, about an inch, occurred at Whitefish Point on 11 November (TPr).

THE MIGRATION

Waterfowl migration was generally good, though late, with some excellent numbers for some species including high numbers of Long-tailed Ducks at Whitefish Point, high numbers of Black Scoters from several locales, and an extraordinary state record count of Ruddy Ducks at the Muskegon Wastewater System, Muskegon County.

An exceptional number of raptors, mainly Broad-winged Hawks, was recorded at Manistique in September (SH). This may have been due to the dominance of southwesterly winds during the peak of Broad-winged Hawk migration, which was well below normal at Lake Erie Metropark (GN, SCu). Owls were low in number, with few reports of Snowy and Boreal Owls, and no Great Grays. The number of Northern Hawk Owls was up slightly from recent years.

Shorebird habitat "inland" was about typical at locations such as Pointe Mouillee and the Muskegon Wastewater System. Shorebird numbers were about average or somewhat below, with the exception of Whimbrel and American Avocet, which staged better-than-average migrations through the state. Good peak counts for Red Knot and Stilt Sandpiper were noted at Pte. Mouillee.

One of the major surprises of the season was the influx of alcids onto Lake Michigan, with an amazing two species recorded (one found dead) which may or may not have been correlated with the record number of Western Grebes in the state as well.

Kaplan noted an extraordinary morning flight of passerines on Manitou Island, Keweenaw County on 7 September, with an estimated 22,500 to 45,000 (!) in 1.5 hours, peaking at around 8:00 a.m. A large flight of Blue Jays in flocks up to 50 was observed in southern Hillsdale County on 8 October, which also included a meadowlark, Cedar Waxwings, American Goldfinches, and a Sharp-shinned Hawk (JR). A good Blue Jay flight was also recorded at the hawkwatch at Lake Erie Metropark. Warbler migration was fairly good, better than many recent years as far as numbers and diversity, and some species lingered late, especially Yellow-rumped and Palm Warblers in the Upper Peninsula, where they were joined by "Audubon's" Warblers (pending acceptance by the Michigan Bird Records Committee) late in the season.

Sparrow migration was rather poor, with a few exceptionally early pioneers, but becoming scarce through the end of the period. The number of *Ammodramus* sparrows found this fall was much higher than in most recent fall seasons. Some were well seen and identified, others could only be identified as one of a species pair (i.e., Le Conte's/Nelson's, or Nelson's/

Saltmarsh). Also, more Grasshopper and Henslow's Sparrows than normal were reported. Winter finches were notably sparse after last winter's excellent numbers of some species. Bohemian Waxwings came in somewhat late and in about normal numbers.

The fall season is always the best time of year for vagrants and rarities, but this fall was especially good and included: Ross's Goose; Brant; King Eider; two King/Common Eider; two Pacific Loons (1 accepted, 1 p.a.); five Western Grebes; two Aechmophorus grebes (1 accepted, 1 p.a.); a Plegadis ibis species; Mississippi Kite; two Ruffs; three Red Phalaropes; Arctic Tern; Pomarine Jaeger; Long-tailed Jaeger; Dovekie found dead (p.a., 3rd state record); Ancient Murrelet (7th state record); Barn Owl; a lingering Chuckwill's-widow from summer; Green Violetear (5th state record); two Rufous Hummingbirds; two Scissor-tailed Flycatchers; lingering Fish Crows from summer; two "Audubon's" Yellow-rumped Warblers (3rd state record, p.a.); two Nelson's/Saltmarsh Sparrows; and a Chestnut-collared Longspur (5th state record).



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Answer to Photo Quiz 34, V17N1

I'd like to thank Jon Wuepper for offering me the opportunity to resurrect the photo quiz. I don't consider myself to be an expert, but I'm honored to be able to present birds that have challenged me, those that I've learned from, and those that bring out interesting points. Who knows? We may even review a butterfly or two.

The first step in identifying a gull is to age the bird. This can be more difficult in the summer than the winter since most gulls have fresher plumage in the winter. The gray mantle and wing coverts, white tertial crescent (white rear edges of the folded gray wing feathers), and white-tipped black primaries generally indicate that this bird is approaching maturity. The lack of a full hood, however, would suggest that this bird is a sub-adult, probably a year away from full maturity

Why is this not the common Bonaparte's Gull? The quiz bird's prominent eye arcs, darker mantle, and lack of a white leading edge to the primaries all argue against it. Black-headed Gull can be eliminated similarly. In addition to a lighter mantle, Little Gull would have shorter wings and lack eye arcs.

These eliminations leave us with Laughing and Franklin's as the darkermantled hooded gulls. Laughing Gull is larger, with a longer heavier bill. The first picture suggests a more petite bill. Franklin's has broader eye-arcs, which seem to be present. The wing pattern is, however, where the identification of many gulls is made or broken. The primaries of an adult Franklin's Gull have large terminal white spots while Laughing Gulls exhibit smaller terminal spots. This bird has small terminal spots. One of the easiest features to separate Franklin's from Laughing adults is that Franklin's has white between the black ends of the primaries and rest of the upper wing's gray. This mark is best seen with the wing extended and can be hard to see with it folded; if it was strongly present, however, we would probably be able to see it in the second photo. If our bird was an adult, the smaller terminal spots and lack of white at the base of the black on the folded wing might suggest Laughing. However, as we initially established, our bird is not an adult. Looking at the underside of the tenth (outermost) primary we see distal black give way to extensive pale at the base of the primary. Laughing Gulls of any age will not show pale outer primary bases; the feathers will be dark through their lengths. This bird therefore is a Franklin's Gull.

By realizing that this bird is not an adult we can avoid a classic identification pitfall, that a first summer Franklin's Gull closely resembles an adult Laughing Gull. Franklin's is the only gull to molt flight feathers twice annually. Perhaps because of these extra molts, Franklin's "gets ahead" and shows a more adult appearance at a younger age. Our bird does have white tips to the primaries, but they are not as extensive as those usually displayed by an adult Franklin's. The head markings of 1-year-old Franklin's Gulls are variable and can range from a full breeding hood to a winter-like half-hood. The young Franklin's Gulls also frequently lack the white band on the upper wing between the black wingtips and the rest of the gray of the upper wing. An excellent summary of this identification problem can be found in Kenn Kaufman's Advanced Birding.

I'd like to acknowledge both Phil Chu's original discussion of these photos as well as his many helpful comments in improving this column.
