### Instructions

All regularly occurring species are listed on this form. **Documentation** is required for any species on the Review List (right) or any species not on this form. Reports of these species will not be published in the Michigan Bird Survey if documentation has not been accepted by the Michigan Bird Records Committee. Documentation should be as thorough as possible, and focus on a detailed description of the bird in question, and discuss the elimination of similar species. Certain difficult to identify species, or unseasonal reports of common species, should also be documented. Some of these species are shown in **Bold** on the forms, along with the circumstances that may require documentation (example, **D: UP** means document in Upper Peninsula only). These reports may be accepted or rejected by the seasonal compiler, or forwarded to the MBRC for review, at their discretion.
