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As the state's first conservation organization, formed in 1904 in response to a critical need for bird and native habitat conservation, Michigan Audubon has a long history as an independent advocacy organization. As such, we are poised and obliged to address the systemic racism and myriad inequities and forms of discrimination that have created barriers to all people learning about, enjoying, and helping to protect birds, wildlife, and the natural world.

We believe the problems facing birds and the environment require <u>everyone's</u> input and involvement. Having varied perspectives helps us better understand and solve the complex problems of an ever-changing world, ecologically, socially, and politicallyspeaking.

Just as ecosystems rely on biodiversity to thrive, a nonprofit organization thrives in achieving its mission when it is proactively inclusive, equal, diverse, and just.
